Note 1: Students pursuing the **B.A.** in Criminal Justice take 11-15 credits of Electives; 9 credits of B.A. Requirement in Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, Quantification, or Foreign Language; and Foreign Language to the 12<sup>th</sup>-credit level (3 semesters at Penn State Abington). Students pursuing the **B.S.** in Criminal Justice take 14-18 credits of Electives and 12 credits of Skills Enhancement Courses in consultation with the advisor.

Note 2: Keep track to fulfill Penn State Abington's **General Education requirements:**

- 6 credits in Arts
- 6 credits in Humanities
- 6 credits in Social and Behavioral Sciences (fulfilled by major requirements in Sociology)
- 3 credits Health and Physical Activity
- 6 credits in Quantification
- 9 credits in Natural Science
- 3 credits in Other Cultures (for the B.A.), *and* 3 credits in International Cultures (for B.A. and B.S.) *can double count* with the courses listed above (example: any Western Heritage History = both Humanities and International Cultures requirement; SOCI 120 = Social/Behavioral Science and Other Cultures)

Note 3: Students who took COMP 111 prior to July 2015 will receive credit for ENGL202B. After that date, student who take COMP 111 will receive no transfer credit because the course transfers as COMP 110. COMP 111 is under review. Current Bucks CCC students should request permission to *substitute* COMP 114 for COMP 111 to receive credit for ENGL202C, Technical Writing.

Note 4: MATH 115 and 215, *combined*, are equivalent to Penn State's STAT200, a required, 4-credit course. The additional credits become Electives.

Note 5: Suggest CRIJ 140, 250, and 275 to fulfill Major requirements for the B.A. and B.S. (CRIMJ 220, 210, and 230 respectively).

Note 6: Penn State suggests one of the following to fulfill the General Education, Health and Physical Activity requirement: PSYC 125 or HLTH 103, 110, 120, or 130. Note that Penn State requires 3 credits of Health and Physical Activity.

Note 7: **Additional Policies:** Transferable courses **MUST** have a grade of **"C" or better**. Developmental and remedial courses are **NOT** included in transferable credit. Course work from another college or university must be evaluated separately. Penn State Abington's degree requires a **minimum 2.0 GPA** for transfer as calculated by Penn State.

Before admission, students must complete certain high school courses, including math and foreign language. See [psu.edu/admissions/](https://psu.edu/admissions/).
